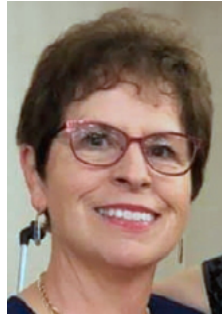

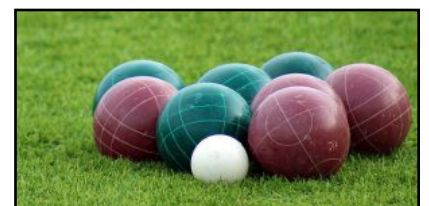

My husband Tom and I have been members since 2018. We have been married for 15 years and we both have a passion for travel. I am Italian from my father's side of the family, and Native American and Finnish on my mother's side. The majority of my Italian side of the family live in the greater Boston, Massachusetts, area after my great grandparents immigrated and settled in Quincy, Massachusetts, from Sulmona (Abruzzo Region), Italy. Tom and I have traveled to Italy several times and have been lucky enough to visit Sulmona twice. We planned to make Sulmona our home base for a trip in December of 2020, but this was canceled due to Covid. I hope to go back again within the next year.

I am also enrolled in the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians. My mother, Roberta, was born on our tribe's reservation. This dynamic does bring forth pause for me when it comes to things such as Columbus. I have always felt conflicted, but I hope my Indigenous and Italian heritage will open constructive dialogue and bring a different perspective on a passionate topic.

We have all endured two years of disruption, uncertainty, and additional stress as a result of this pandemic. For some, fear may have been and still is a relevant factor. For others, fatigue and a desire to move beyond our current state may be the focus. We all process stress, change, grief, and uncertainty differently. I encourage each of us to keep this in mind in the months ahead as we decide whether to meet in person or via zoom is discussed. I would like to gauge everyone's comfort with meeting in person and/or continuing via zoom. Please feel free to email me to let me know if you feel comfortable meeting in person or would like to continue meeting via zoom. I would also like to ask everyone to think about fun-
