the local lodge presidents each month has been a positive derived from our restricted COVID environments. It has been exciting to exchange techniques between lodges to connect our members throughout the Northwest.

Accordingly, we invite you to enjoy a Black Diamond Lodge method of connecting our members by sharing the family story of Paul Pioli, who is a longstanding OSDIA member and who has actively participated in several local and state positions in the Grand

Lodge of the Northwest. My father Peter Pioli was born on June 6, 1903, in the town of Canigiano di Garfagnana. It's a town in the northern area of the province of Lucca. Since my grandfather was recruited by Pacific Coast Coal Co. to mine coal in Black Diamond, he came ahead of my father and grandmother. My father and grandmother left Italy in 1906. My grandfather came aboard the "Vincenzo Florio," and my father and grandmother came aboard the

"Lo Savoie." Upon completion of grade school, my father felt he'd had enough schooling and not wanting to work in the coal mines, left for Seattle to work in the shipyards. While in the shipyards, he became a journeyman machinist. He returned to Black Diamond to complete his education and graduated high school in 1924. He played all the sports and had a lifetime of friends. He often said that as a freshman he was older than the oldest senior. He became active in union activities during the coal mine strike at Black Diamond.



Later as a business agent for the machinist union, he was active in the Boeing strike of 1948. My mother Anita Angeli Pioli was born in Black Diamond. Her family came from Castiglione di Garfagnana which isn't very far from Canigiano. In fact, you drive past the town going to Canigiano. My mother had tragedv early in her life when her father Morris Angeli was killed in the Ravensdale Coal Mine explosion on November 15, 1915.

After a time, my grandmother married Peter Giannotti who was related to the Pennacchi clan, living in Ravensdale and moving to Kanasket, which is a



couple of miles east of Ravensdale.
My parents married in 1936 and moved to Seattle. The relatives of my father in Black Diamond were the Fontanas, Draghis, and Casinis. The Pioli, Fontana, and Draghi families all lived near each other. As chil-

dren, my sister Armida and I spoke only Italian at home, but when we started school, our Italian speaking stopped. My mother did not want confusion on our part with our education. During WWII my sister and I went with my father to the Italian Prisoner of War Camps in Seattle, where some of our relatives were living. Being away from their own families, they enjoyed having small children around speaking Italian with them.




