

We welcome you to join the activities planned for December 9 to celebrate the holidays. As we close our 85th year in 2022, Leonardo Folino would like to share the following historical points about Lodge 1809 that he has researched in collaboration as a docent for the Black Diamond Museum.

The Black Diamond Sons of Italy was founded in 1937. I was



told that to assist in founding the lodge Oliva Rossi Merlini had to have one of her brothers drive her to the various Italian homes in the area to sign up members because she didn't know how to drive.

The Lodge had accrued the following from its past: a

1937 Gold Lion Banner; the Lodge Charter; the Proclamation from L'Ordine Figli d'Italia in America (Order Children of Italy in America) proclaiming the Black Diamond Lodge duly installed; a plaque from our Lodge sponsor Loggia Tacoma No. 1175 commemorating the occasion; and a couple of older regalia with a gavel from Spokane Lodge 1500 (1928-1955). The rest of our Lodge artifacts were thought to be lost. In 2016 our longest-serving member (70 years) Marie Merlini Freeman passed away. Discovered in her basement were four boxes of well-preserved Lodge relics that her daughter Livia Ziebarth bequeathed to the Lodge. In those boxes were a Lion Statue, two handcrafted wooden boxes with black and white marbles used to vote on accepting or rejecting potential members. In addition, the original membership applications were filled out by the 97 charter members of the Black Diamond Lodge, a set of the first original Lodge regalia, the original Lodge seal, and four Masonic-style gavels. In 2019 the Black Diamond Museum provided the Black Diamond Sons of Italy (SOI) with a display case in which to display these items. The Lodge was originally planning to celebrate the viewing of the display case in conjunction with the first Italian Day in Black Diamond, but then covid struck. Two years later on May 14, 2022, we were able to celebrate the first Italian Day in Black Diamond and the official viewing of the display case, in addition to the 85th Anniversary of the Black Diamond Lodge 1809.



The Lodge display case is the anchor of the Black Diamond Italian history located in the Museum. Around the corner from the display case is a photo of charter member Ruby Favro Andros-

Next to that photo are her parents—Mary Hinaut Favro and Joseph Favro, who were one of the first Italians in Black Diamond having relocated with the Black Diamond Coal Company when it moved to the Washington Territory in 1885. Around 1909 or 1910 Joseph Favro loaned money to Bill Hadley to build the Black Diamond Bakery. There are photos of Joe Silvestri's family from 1916 (Joe is not in the photo because he was born in 1920), along with the Vernarelli, Carnino, Dal Santo families, and more.

The Black Diamond Museum is located at 32627 Railroad Avenue, Black Diamond, WA 98010. Museum hours are Thursday 9 am - 3 pm; Saturday and Sunday 11 am - 3 pm. Come early, have breakfast at the bakery/restaurant, and then mosey on down to the museum. Bring the kids and grand-kids, so they can ring the bell and blow the whistle on the train engine, and operate a plunger-activated explosion box (hooked up to lights). There is a model coal town with a train that hauls coal plus a great many other items to discover. Watch for more details about the Palmer Merlini family as Livia Palmer Ziebarth contributes to the beginning of 2023 in the January edition of the NWIN.
