I was asked by Marlene Palazzo to share a bit of my Italian ancestry, so here it is. I grew up in Hamilton, Skagit County, a small town of fewer than 300 people prone to flooding every few years. Hamilton wasn't always small. A little more than 120 years ago the town was touted to be the "Pittsburgh of the West." Just across the Skagit River stood two mountains: Coal Mountain and Iron Mountain. Many people came to the area, including Italian immigrants, in hopes of finding good-paying jobs. Unfortunately, the coal was soft and the iron ore was limited. However, many stayed. My great-grandfather, Peter Jacobin (lacobucci), was born in 1841 in Pietrovairano, Caserta, Italy. We have his diary, and it is an interesting story of his life in Italy. Peter arrived in New York at Castle Garden several years before Ellis Island was the main point of US entry. He spoke several languages and for several years was employed as an interpreter at the port of New York. While I could find no record of him leaving New York, he made his way to Sparta, Illinois, where he and his wife, Catherine McHale, managed to have four children including my grandfather, Frank. Peter and Catherine continued their western journey, and we next find them in Roslyn, Washington, where he was a shopkeeper until a massive fire destroyed many businesses, including Peter's.



This was about the time Peter must have heard of the next Pittsburg, so we find them in Hamilton in the early 1900s where he had a saloon, a store, a movie theater, and several other enterprises. Peter died in 1921. From his obituary it reads, "Up to a few years ago he led a very active and adventurous life, making money

easily and spending generously. He looked upon life as a good and pleasant thing, and it was his pride to be

called a little more than just and fair in his dealings with his fellows."

My grandfather, Frank, and his wife, Ada, had two children. Joe, my father, was born in 1909 and died in 1998; and John, my uncle, was born quite deformed but he was also extremely intelligent. Due to constant flooding and a divorce between my parents, my mother, sister, and I moved to Sedro Woolley in the 1960s. Following my graduation from the University of Washington in 1974, I worked for Southland Corporation (parent company of 7/11 Stores).

I met Linda L. Jordan in 1975 and we were married that same year. Linda's Italian ancestry is through her mother's side of the family, named "Regis" (King), in the Turin, Piedmont, area of Italy. My company moved us several times from Seattle to Portland, OR, to Medford, OR, and Eugene, OR. In fact, we were in Eugene when cousins of mine, Bonnie and Fred Duncan from the Black Diamond Lodge, came to Eugene for the Installation of the Alta Monte Lodge, but somehow we missed the chance to be Charter members.

Both Linda and I quit our jobs in Eugene and, with our son James, moved back to Seattle in 1985. A few years later, Bonnie and Fred Duncan told us about a camping club they belonged to called the Rolling Romans. We went on one of their outings and loved it, so we wanted to join. They said there was only one requirement: we had to join the Sons of Italy. Well, we both said "that's fine," so we joined the Black Diamond Lodge. I became the Recording Secretary shortly thereafter and then became Lodge President in 1994, followed by 30+ years as Editor of the Northwest Italian News.
