connections originated in Black Diamond. The following is a family story shared by Bonnie Birch, granddaughter of Abramo Pennacchi, to begin the New Year 2022 with more information on the Pennacchi clan.

Abramo Pennacchi (my grandfather) was born in Pianacchi di Garfagnana in 1881. In 1903, he came to the U.S. with his brother Dario and settled in Black Diamond, Washington. Abramo returned to Italy to bring his wife Adele Giannotti Pennacchi, their daughter Fernanda, and his brother's wife Amelia to Black Diamond.

Abramo and Adele had four children, three of whom were born in Black Diamond. First was Fernanda (Fern born in Italy) who married Domenic Muscolo, then Natale (Nat) who married Mary Pallecchio, Elisabetta (Betty) married to Lindo Garbini, and Esther (my mother) married to Donald Birch.

My grandfather was an extremely talented man. He first worked in the mine but never went back after they went on strike. He made a living as a builder of homes and was a master craftsman working with terrazzo. His work can be seen in the Black Diamond cemetery where he built many of the gravesites including the one for him and his wife. He built the family home in Morganville (a suburb of Black Diamond). The family story we all love to tell is that Abramo made wine during the prohibition. He was, of course, very much in demand but unfortunately, the law found out and put a stop to it.

In 1932, his wife Adele passed away. Abramo later married Maria Pierotti who had three children from her previous marriage. One of her children, Meg Pierotti, is Richard Pierotti's father. Richard's uncle "Boots" Pierotti and his father Meg started the popular Boot's Tavern located on Highway 169 in Black Diamond.

Abramo's first wife Adele Giannotti had a brother Pete Giannotti who lived in Ravensdale. Pete married Armida Angeli who had children from her previous marriage. Her daughter Anita married Pete Pioli and they are the


