We are equally proud to share with you the family story of a past Black Diamond Lodge GLNW State Deputy, CathyLembo:

I am so honored to be asked by the Black Diamond Lodge as their Past State Deputy to speak about my Uncle Tony Mola who was a long-time member of the Lodge.

My grandparents immigrated from Italy. Grandpa Michele Mola is from Mola di Bari, and Grandma Esther Cresto Mola is from a small town in northern Italy called Chivazo. My grandfather worked on the railroad from Ravensdale to Cle Elum and up to Bothell. Grandpa was the lead on the line, but during the war there was a group of women who worked alongside him, one being my grandmother.

Uncle Tony served 40 years in the Navy. He learned mechanics and electrical work which led him to run Utilities Service Co., a successful mechanical and electri-

My mom, Frances, was 9 years younger than Tony. They also had an older brother named Johnny. Many years ago, Tony won a trip to Italy and took my mom. On this trip, they went to my grandfather's hometown in Bari where they met one of their uncles and several cousins. While there they learned that they were part owners of the family olive grove. They eventually signed their part over to the family so that the government wouldn't take it away from them.



I remember Uncle Tony always loved being around people, was very kind, and many who knew him loved his smile. His smile is what I miss the most.

I was wanting to learn Italian, and I noticed North Seattle Community College offered Italian classes in the evening.

I chose the class taught

by Marlene Palazzo, because her last name was Italian. During the class I learned she was President of the Black Diamond Lodge, and she knew my Uncle Tony Mola who was a member. She invited me to come to one of the meetings as a surprise to Uncle Tony. Thereafter, I joined the SnoKing Lodge, which was located

close to where I lived, and began my active participation in the Grand Lodge of the Northwest.

I treasured my time as State Deputy of Black Diamond, and this lodge still holds a special place in my heart.

I recommend reading this book as it covers three generations of an Italian Family over the periods of 1882 -90, 1911-12, and 1942-45. 

Nancy Carle shared a picture that is very special to her from a trip to the Vatican during the Holy Year


