Since 1965, the City of Auburn has honored our Veterans. Plan to join in this year to pay tribute, thank and honor Veterans and active military members on Saturday, November 11 at 11:00 am on Main Street in downtown Auburn.

The 2023 parade marks the 58th anniversary of this signature event in Auburn. Over the years, Auburn's Veterans Parade has become one of the largest parades of its' kind West of the Mississippi, quite possibly the largest in the United States. The parade typically boasts almost 6,000 participants and over 200 entries including military vehicles and equipment, military and veteran units, over 25 marching bands, ROTC Units, antique military vehicles and classic cars, community groups and more.

The 11:00 am parade, typically commences with a military flyover by a C-17, followed by a UH-1H Huey helicopter flyover.

I am Jeanne Fasano, and as your 4th Vice President, I have taken on a project to raise awareness of Autism and hopefully raise some funds as well. I am the grandmother of a beautiful 21-year-old grandson who is autism affected. When looking at the prevalent statistic for 2023, I find one child in every 36 is diagnosed with varying degrees of Autism. That figure was 1 in 44 in 2021, and 1 in 110 in 2006.

Those statistics would tend to make us think there is an epidemic of autism. Experts tend to believe it is more a matter of getting better at diagnosing. The statistics tell me several things. With the number of OSDIA members in the US, I am certainly not the only one with an affected family member. It also tells me that there is likely an area of need that our organization might be able to fill.

In the coming months, I will be providing further information. I would also love to hear from others in OSIDA in any of the following ways:

1. You have been affected by autism in your family or extended family.

You have suggestions for needs that are not being addressed adequately in your area. An example for my grandson is opportunities for socialization.
You have fundraising ideas.

great-grandparents came from Calabria (Cosenza and Reggio Calabria). On my Dad's side, my great-grandparents were Saverio Maletta and Maria Mancusco. They had seven children named Joe, John, Alfred, Albert, Tony, Christina, and an adopted son named Louie. After a trek across the U.S., the family settled in Taylor, Washington, in the early 1910s. Also making his home in Taylor was a handsome young man named Gabriele Yazzolino (lazzolino). He came to America in 1913 and found his way to Taylor in 1920. At the time it was a thriving mining and brick-producing town. Most of the bricks for the Seattle Pike Place Market came from Taylor. He met and married my grandmother, Christina Maletta, when he was 25 and she was 16. They had four children—Rich, Mary, Sam, and Frank Yazzolino. Eventually, they all moved to Seattle, specifically the Atlantic Street area (affectionately named Garlic Gulch). My Grandfather worked for the Seattle Department of Engineering. He helped build the I-90 tunnel and was instrumental in developing several innovations and safeguards for the Engineering Department that became standard practice. My Mother's parents were Antonio and Virginia (Clausi) Reda, also, from Reggio, Calabria. They had three daughters—Josephine (Pep), Mary, and Alda. The family settled in Portland, Oregon. My Grandfather worked for the railroad and played a great harmonica. My Grandmother was a very talented and hard-working fabricator and seamstress. I have very fond memories of summers spent with them. The sunlight would spill through the leaves of the fig trees lining our street . . . Magical! My parents were Rich and Pep Yazzolino. They had four children in five years, busy, busy! My Dad worked for Rosella Fruit & Produce and NW Construction. My Mother did volunteer work and was a great pizza and bread maker. The aroma of freshly baked bread . . . Heaven! My wonderful brothers are Tony, Sam, and Rich, and my great sister-in-law is Gail. Lastly, I have three children-Ann Marie, Anthony, and Elizabeth . . My Joys!! That's all folks. As we all can say about families, there is a lot more to tell but let us reminisce over a nice glass of wine. CIAO!


