### From the desk of Mary Jane Rogers, GLNW Financial Secretary:

Most of you know this already, but for those who are newer officers...this is just a reminder that each time your lodge has an event, you should request "Proof of Insurance" also known as "Certification of Insurance" from the Grand Lodge. Many church halls as well as other city halls require some proof of insurance before we can use their facilities. Each lodge pays an annual installment based on their membership to pay for this insurance. The insurance includes \$1,000,000 in property and personal liabilities and \$10,000 in medical expenses in case someone gets injured at your event or because of your event.

When your lodge is having an event, please contact me, Mary Jane, 3 to 4 weeks prior ahead of your event by email with the following information and a certification of insurance will be emailed back to you. I will need the following: Lodge Name and number, date of the event, Place / Address, and the event name.

Another timely reminder is that of filing lodge taxes with the IRS. A few years back, there were several lodges who repeatedly failed to file and after a few years, the IRS stripped them of their non-profit status. When this happens, back taxes need to be filed and a request needs to be sent to the IRS to be reinstated. This can be an arduous and costly thing to accomplish. You should receive a postcard in the mail from the IRS no later than June of each year. If you do not receive this postcard, please contact the IRS immediately. Please send a copy to me, Janet, so that I have a record of the filing. If you have any questions, please contact us. DiLuck in the June-July edition. It is our great pleasure to share the origins of her family with you in this issue.

Nonna Persia left the Comune di Martignacco, a small town near Udine in Northeastern Italy in 1900. They spoke Friulian (which is now a recognized language in

Italy). Like many before her, she wanted to come to the "New World" to start a new chapter in life. She was a farm girl, one of 13, with brothers Ferro, Forte, Volcano, and Guerra all strong names for strong people. Looking back at the family tree for generations, they stayed in the same place and married people from the same little village as was common back then. Not knowing the language and coming to America to get married had to be a great adventure into the unknown. Seeing the Statue of Liberty for the first time must

have been an epic moment. She married her sweetheart and started a family in the Georgetown area of Seattle. Being resourceful as she was, she financed a trip back to the "Old Country" to visit family by selling Grappa from her still in the basement. Can you imagine how much grappa she had to sell to get back to Italy? She had two children, Eva and my father Lido, who is Janet Henkel's cousin.



Nonna Catarina (front row, second from left) was born in Sarajevo in the Austria-Hungary Empire. When she was two, they moved to Fumie, Italy. Her roots are a Slavic-Austrian mixture, as was the region at that time. She married my grandfather and had four children. Eleonora, the only girl, was my mother. After World War II, they became displaced



citizens in Italy and waited for documents to reunite the family. They had the opportunity to come to the United States, as my great-grandmother was already in Philadelphia. She said goodbye to her dear

friends in Italy for the last time. They were going to Philadelphia and the friends were going to parts unknown. Imagine my mother and Nonna's surprise


