



Northwest Italian News, December, 2023



raffle was conducted at our Thanksgiving meeting and won by National VP Tony Anderson. When you receive this edition of the NWIN, the desserts from our Fall Fundraiser will have sweetened the

Thanksgiving celebrations at many households. Once again, we invite you to join our Christmas festivities and exuberant ornament exchange on December 8 (please see our Facebook invitation for details).

The early Italian immigrants had a burning desire to succeed and assimilate into their newly adopted country, so to assist in obtaining that goal they formed beneficial aid societies based on ethnic lines. The Black Diamond Sons of Italy was an organization born out of this desire. Leonardo Folino shares the following vignettes from his extensive research as a docent for the Black Diamond Museum to complement his writings in the December 2022 edition of the NWIN. He explains how the Lodge was organized through the efforts of many Italians in Black Diamond. Marie Merlini Freeman



told Leonardo
that her mother
did not know
how to drive a
car, so one of
Marie's Uncles
would drive her
around to the
various Italian
farms to sign
up prospective

members. A May 1948 article by Tony Fantello in the Lo Svegliarino (forerunner of the NWIN) mentions the helpful effort of Dominic Agari, James Vernarelli, and Margaret Vernarelli to organize the Black Diamond Sons of Italy.

"Our membership was well over a hundred members when we first organized but it dwindled during the

war years and now the peace is here again, the membership is again coming up. We hope to get to our pre-war number as soon as possible."

"Many of the officers have held offices practically since the lodge organized, such as Frank Costi in the office of Treasurer. Many others have held offices for two or three terms and more. These officers have to be commended for their work because they keep the lodge together."

As a result of their combined diligence, the Black Diamond Sons of Italy was chartered in 1937 under the sponsorship of the Loggia Tacoma 1175. Today we have eight Lodge members who are descendants of the Black Diamond chartered members and who continue to honor the tradition of Liberty, Equality, and Fraternity. For 86 years the Sons of Italy has been a part of the tapestry of the Black Diamond community through war, demise of the coal industry, and regeneration as a suburban oasis. Mirroring the determination of the ancestors, the Black Diamond Sons of Italy members strive to go forth to serve their communities. Leonardo Folino



pockets of Italians near 23rd and Sprague St and around 56th and Washington St. The neighborhood surrounded St. Rita Di Cascia Catholic church much like you might see in many towns in Italy. This national Italian parish held 3 masses on Sundays where the announcements and weekly events of the parish were said first in English and then in Italian.

Nearby was the business district on "K" St. which had a variety of Italian-owned stores including – Frank Milano's Grocery Store; Carlo's Barbershop; Pete Verone's Meats; Tommy Vercillo's Bakery; Jasper Canele's Shoe Repair; Jim DeRosa's Gas Station; Vic Miele's Café and Liberty Tavern. Then on S. 19th and Cushman, you could find Ralph Manza's Grocery Store. The neighborhood was filled with Italian superstitions, depending on where your family came from in Italy, such as: Don't throw a hat on the bed.

Never seat 13 people at the dinner table.

Never let a black cat cross your path.

Don't go directly home after a funeral.

In our Parents' Day, most babies were born at home just like their ancestors. My mother said that in those days you only went to the hospital to visit someone really sick.

It was often difficult for many immigrants to understand each other due to the various dialects spoken in the different villages in Italy. The first Italian group to get together in Tacoma was a men's only group who called themselves the Progressive Italian Americans (P.I.A.). They had meetings but no other events. This group dissolved when a new group called the Victor Emanuele Lodge was formed. Three men in the new lodge researched a national Italian organization, founded by Vincenzo Sellaro, called the Sons of Italy. This fraternal organization offered many benefits and fun events for its members. The local lodge applied for membership to the National Sons of Italy's Supreme Lodge in 1923. The Supreme Lodge's acceptance made Tacoma the first lodge in the state of Washington. Their new title was Tacoma Lodge #1175, making them the "Mother Lodge of the Northwest." The founding fathers of our Lodge were Desiderio Laterza, Giuseppe Cozza, and Tommaso Marzano.


