

Black Diamond

#1809, Black Diamond, WA

Black Diamond featured the origins of the Roman Valentine's Day in the February 2022 issue of the NWIN. The title of this special day (Valentino) holds a proud meaning for the population of member Michele Palazzo's hometown of Castellaneta in the province of Taranto and region of Puglia. Actor Rudolfo Valentino (1895-1926) was born in Castella-



neta and made a significant impact on the silent movie industry when he immigrated to America. Details of the struggles this Italian American endured can be found at https://www.biography.com/actor/ru-

dolph-valentino. An interesting fact is that Michele's cousin owns Rudolfo's original family home as pictured.

The April 2022 issue of the NWIN introduced you to the Malvesti paternal heritage of our President Janice Malvesti-Cole on the East Coast. We now invite you to join Janice and Tom Cole on their recent return to the Malvesti origins in Italy. Black Diamond Lodge President, Janice Malvesti-Cole and her husband, Black Diamond Lodge Treasurer Tom Cole, have travelled to Italy many times. Janice's father's side comes from Sulmona, Italy, as her great-grandparents, Antonio and Anna immigrated to the United States from Italy. Tom Cole's mother's side of the family comes from Feistritz an der Gail, Austria, just a few miles from the Italian border (close to Tarvisio). Tom's great-grandparents, Martin and Lucille, told stories about frequently crossing over into Italy

for vegetables before they immigrated to the United States. Sulmona (pronounced Sue-Mona) is located about an hour and forty-five minutes east of Rome and about forty-five minutes west of the Adriatic Sea. The beautiful town of Sulmona is located in the Abruzzo region located at the foot of the Majella mountains and is famous for being the capital of sugared-coated almonds, known as "confetti" in Italian. Its streets are adorned with colorful confetti bouquets, which



you can buy in any imaginable flavor – Nutella, tiramisu, ricotta, and pear just to name a few. Sulmona's famous aqueduct in the center of town dates back to 1256 and along the

aqueduct you'll find Piazza Garibaldi, known for a medieval tournament in the summer and a market held each Wednesday and Saturday.

Tom and Janice have been fortunate to travel to Europe many times and had a trip scheduled for December 2020 which was cancelled due to COVID. When this was cancelled, Tom had made an arrangement with a local artist in Sulmona, Italy, to have a painting completed to give to Janice for Christmas. This painting was then mailed and while it was in-transit, it was held up and confiscated by the Italian post office. About two months later, the painting was released by the Italian post office to the artist, Lorenzo, who painted



it – long story, short, the Italian post office viewed this art piece as possible theft of art. Lesson learned, don't mail art from Italy or if you do, expect to pay a high cost for permitting. Tom worked with the artist, Lorenzo, and told him to hold onto the painting until we can pick it up in person.

Fast forward, to December 2021 when we thought we'd make it back

to Italy as we booked a trip but once again due to COVID, the trip was cancelled. Then, in 2022 we booked a trip and were beyond thrilled to return to Italy. In late December, we kicked off our trip in Amsterdam, Netherlands, before head-

Application information and requirements:

- Scholarship awards are open to students who are currently full-time high school seniors, college graduate or undergraduate students, or vocational/trade school students. High School seniors must submit a letter of acceptance from a college, university, or trade school.
- 2. The applicant must be a member or have a parent or grandparent with membership in #1390 for a minimum of two calendar years. Dues for 2023 must be paid.
