

My 14 years as a 4-H member, including two years in the WSU Crimson Clover 4-H Club. and my extensive leadership in many organizations qualified me to be selected as a Cultural Ambassador to share and learn protocols with another nation. I was confident that my one semester of German at WSU would influence my country assignment. Well, Italy is physically located near Germany!

I was privileged to travel from New York to LeHavre,

France, on the U.S. Rotterdam; however, I was ghastly seasick the entire seven days! Nonetheless, the weight loss was delightfully recovered during the luxurious business luncheons with province officials and delicious home-cooked meals prepared by my 12 host families. Before departure, I was oriented in Washington, DC, to always maintain professional comportment and to be prepared to share agricultural information about Washington State, such as bushels of wheat harvested per acre. During my first meeting with province officials (ten men and one woman), at a formal six-course luncheon in a luxurious Modena restaurant, my first question was, "Do you like Italian men?"

In the four-month preparation period after receiving my destination country, I learned several Italian words (but no verbs to connect them), how to count to 20, and the translation of "Yes" (Si) and "No" (No). With caution to maintain the professionalism of a Cultural Ambassador and not to offend my hosts, I responded, "Si." The second question was, "Would you like to marry one?" In response to my overt embarrassment, the entire table roared in laughter . . . and, thus, the tremendous Italian sense of humor (always pointed at self, not others) began my seduction by Italy, as quoted from the book jacket of Dianne Hales's "La Passione".

Attending Catholic services with the families imparted the spiritual birthrights of the Italians and influenced my conversion to Catholicism four years after my return to the States. My life in Italy was immersed in families that accepted me as their offspring, many of whom traveled to visit me at subsequent locations. I was honored to learn about the varied traditions, foods, agriculture, and architecture throughout 10 of the 20 Italian regions. I was not able to learn the dialects between towns, but my fluency in standard Italian (originating from the dialect of Florence) progressed adequately to converse and share our love of humor.

As I shared presentations throughout Washington State upon my return home, it was my sincere goal to reciprocate the respect, love, and appreciation given to me as a U.S. Cultural Ambassador to Italy. I still have contact with province officials and my host families. I



have made more than 14 returns to the land of innumerable historical proportions and the families who continue to share their unconditional familial love with me. Please anticipate the culmination of how I became an American ITALIAN when I incorporated my husband Michele into the March article.




