





The attraction for our immigrating Italian ancestors to the bustling town of Black Diamond was work in the coal mines . . . long, hard, and dangerous labor. After a long week of work (as deep as 10 levels underground in Mine #14), the families would surround their mine workers with delectable dishes from treasured family recipes, singing in village dialects, and Tarantella dancing accompanied by vivacious music played on accordions and concertinas ("squeeze boxes").



Today Lodge 1809 is a unique lodge in the Grand Lodge of the Northwest with Black Diamond as the nucleus to which our members travel from 15 communities to remember and honor the Italian "Work hard, Play hard" traditions of the former bustling coal mining town. Despite the past three years of pandemic restrictions,

technology has privileged us to maintain contact virtually, and the NWIN allowed us to enhance Northwest family connections through the 32 published family vignettes from our Black Diamond members, State Deputies, and GLNW members in sister lodges. At our April 14 meeting, we initiated Ginny Reda-Yazzolino Ogle of West Seattle into our lodge with a delicious homemade lasagna dinner prepared by our President Janice Malvesti-Cole with homemade strawberry parfaits by Barb Cloud. The Black Diamond


