As we complete our article for this edition, Papa Francesco dies on Easter Day, leaving a massive void for so many, and yet a momentous

acknowledgment of his passing on Resurrection Day. We pray you had a beautiful and contemplative celebration of Easter with your loved ones. We encourage you to remember that May 1 is a national Italian holiday to honor La Festa dei Lavoratori or Labor Day, and May 11 gives tribute to La Festa della Mamma which coincides with our Mother's Day in America.



For baseball enthusiasts, Leonardo Folino shares his research on Italians in Black Diamond and highlights a renowned Northwest athlete born in Black Diamond who brought accolades to his Italian heritage by recognition of his remarkable baseball performance. One of the most well-known people born in the town of Black Diamond, Washington, was

Edo Vanni. Born Edo Joe Vanni on April 2, 1918, to parents Raffaello and Esterina Vanni from Garfagnana in the Province of Lucca, Italy. The Vanni family later moved to Seattle settling in the Queen Anne area. Edo was a player, coach, manager, and front-office executive in minor-league baseball. He was 5 feet 10 inches tall, weighed 180 pounds, and threw and batted



left-handed. As a lifelong resident of the area, he was known as the face of Seattle baseball.

Edo played 15 seasons of minor league baseball. He appeared in 1,408 games, had 5,317 at-bats, 1,697 hits, 220 strikeouts, 516 runs batted in, and 20 home runs. He was a member of the Seattle Rainiers baseball team that won three straight Pacific Coast League Baseball Championships in 1939, 1940, and 1941.

Like many pro athletes, WWII interrupted Edo's career. He joined the Navy and was stationed at Pasco Naval Air Station in Pasco, Washington. After he was discharged, Edo married Margaret Torfason from Vancouver, Canada, in 1947 and had two children. As a manager, the team won 1,072 of a total of 1,978 games. After

retiring from baseball, he became General Manager for the Seattle Angels from 1966 to 1968.

In their one lone season, the Seattle Pilots hired him to be Director of Group Ticket Sales. When the Mariners replaced the Pilots (because of a lawsuit brought against Major League Baseball), Edo was presented a lifetime pass to their stadium along with his own personal parking space. Edo Vanni passed away on April 30,



2007, at the age of 89 in Bellevue, Washington. At the time of his death, Edo was the last surviving member of the Seattle Rainiers that Rainier Brewery Beer Baron Emil Sick purchased in 1938, the same year Sick signed Edo to his first contract. To sweeten the deal, Sick offered Edo 4,000 shares of stock in the Rainier Brewery at 25 cents a share,

which grew to 10,000 shares at \$18 dollars a share, allowing Edo to live a comfortable life. The Black Diamond Board of Officers

Paladeni Riter, who loves to cook and bake traditional Italian food, has shared with me a little history of 2 cakes that are

part of the Easter tradition in Tuscany, Italy. The first one is TORTA CO' BISCHERI (The Pilgrim Cake) "Some say that this cake originated in the 1200s, others in the 1500s, but at least by the 1600s to offered to pilgrims who passed by the town of Pontasserchio (San Giuliana Terme, Tuscany). They walked the Via Francigena from



Canterbury in England to Rome for over 1000 years. The cake was specially made to celebrate the Ascension of Christ and thus is popular in this area over Easter.

The shortcrust pastry contained a mixture of rice, dark chocolate, pine nuts, candied fruit, raisins, and spices." The second one is called COLUMBA PASQUALE (EASTER CAKE) "The dove-shaped Italian Easter cake, the Columba has many legends. One is that in the 6th


century, Columbano, the Irish monk, established a monastery in Italy. The legend is that he had a vision of a dove descending from the heavens that inspired him to bake a cake in the shape of a dove to celebrate Easter. Another legend dating to the 6th century is when King Alboin took over the castle of Pavia. When the castle surrendered, he was offered a dove-shaped sweet bread, a symbol of peace. Another tradition says that the Colomba marks the 1176 Lombardian victory over the Holy Roman Empire. A Christian tradition means it is a symbol of peace and love, and the egg represents the Resurrection. It is basically Panettone in a special shape and today is sometimes served with a limoncello or chocolate sauce and whipped cream.

Whenever the tradition started, today everyone in Italy eats the very tasty "Colomba" on Easter!" Thank you, Beverly, for writing these very interesting articles for me to share with our fellow members. I hope to try and make one someday. As the weather starts to warm up, we hope to play a game of bocce before our meeting next to Jennings park where there's lots of grass just outside our doors. If you haven't already saved the date,
