

**M**y grandfather, Ignazio Toschi, came to America from Italy in 1909 at 23 years old. He returned to Rovolo, Italy, and married my grandmother Oliva on September 6, 1913. They came back to

America, settled in Black Diamond in 1913, and started the family. The first son Iro was born May 19, 1915, but unfortunately died on April 24, 1917. The next son Edo was born February 18, 1918, my dad Evo was born May 9, 1920, and the last son Hugo was born February 10, 1922. They had planned to stay here for five years and then go back to Italy. It was on their 50th wedding anniversary that my dad and uncles paid for their trip back to Rovolo. They stayed in Italy

for three months visiting with relatives and friends. They still owned a house in Rovolo that the relatives had kept up over the years. If you only had one house, there would be no taxes. When my dad went to Rovolo in 1980, he stayed in the house. It was in April when he was there, and they had 18 inches of snow in one night. Rovolo



is in northern Italy at more than 3,000 feet elevation. I have a picture of a metal bucket with long arched handles in which they would heat rocks on the wood stove to put under the covers to heat the bed. In

1922 the family moved to Renton where my grandfather worked for the city in the Street Department. My dad told the story of my grandfather's hand digging the basement and building their house on Cedar Street in Renton. I remember that every square foot of the property was used for a garden, peach tree, fig tree, walnut tree, and chicken coup. There was a wine barrel filled with dirt and holes in the sides where Grandpa planted strawberries.

Grandma always had wood frames with screens spread out in the basement with the wood stove going to dry mushrooms and walnuts. When they were dry, she would store them in two-gallon curved side glass jugs with screw-on lids to use throughout the year. My dad told me about being in the basement and my grandmother tying a rope through the back straps of his bib overalls to a ring in the top of the door to keep him from getting into anything while she was busy. A ringer washing machine and double concrete sink were in the basement for laundry, and a room had a small window high in the wall through which a chute was inserted to fill the room with coal for heating the house. In the upstairs of the house, Grandma was always busy cooking the greatest meals. I am sure we all think that way about our grandma's cooking. I remember



my grandfather taking the shotgun hung over the kitchen door to go pheasant hunting. I still have the shotgun and belt he wore filled with shotgun shells. Grandma used the pheasants for the sauce she made for polenta, one of my favorite meals. I, for sure, miss Grandma's cooking! On Sundays, we would take the newspaper and go to our grandparents' house. Grandma

always had either cookies or Hershey bars to give us for treats. These were the times I should have had an interest in learning the Italian language since my dad talked to my grandparents in Italian. Another interesting story was my dad had 300 silver dollars before he was married and was going to start spending them. My grandmother bought all of them from him. She would then give us grandkids silver dollars when we did well on our report cards from school. We also got silver dollars for our birthdays, Christmas, and whatever other reason she determined we needed one. I still have them all. Edo settled in Sunnyvale California after he got out of the army. He married and had two sons Tim and Lynn and one daughter Sharon. He worked as an electrical engineer until retirement. While attending Renton High School, my dad Evo



worked for August Tonelli who had a farm where Renton Airport is today. After high school, he went into the army and when he returned, he worked for Golden Arrow Dairy which became Meadowsweet and then Foremost Dairy from which he retired. He married my mother on May 8, 1948 (my birthdate is on May 8—don't know how that worked out!). There were three sons in the

of Italy, and they became very active on behalf of the organization. An honorary Evo Toschi Room was built onto the Black Diamond Community Center with donations from Cadman and Boeing and construction by Gabriel Cordi, Joe Silvestri, my dad Evo, and me. In 1980 Dad went to Italy with Meg Pierotti and always wanted to go back, so in 1982 my dad, Shirley, and I went to Italy. They bought a new Mercedes, we picked it up in Germany, and it was great to have our own transportation. We saw some beautiful country on the way to Rovolo. At the time Dad had 27 cousins and his aunt in Rovolo was in her 90s, but you would think she was in her 70s. The house she lived in was over 600 years old. In Rovolo there is an upper road and a lower road. The month of August is vacation time in northern Italy, and the road becomes one-way. The hardest thing for Shirley and me was the language barrier, and my dad had some difficulty with the different dialects from town to town. We were told they had just started teaching a standard Italian language in the schools.

The church where my grandparents were married was still there. We tried to find records of their marriage but had no luck. An interesting thing in the church was a picture frame on the wall with several items pinned on it. We were told that anytime someone left or moved from Rovolo, they would leave something of significance on this board which left us to wonder if grandma or grandpa had left anything. One thing that was a change for me was breakfasts of only cheese and crackers. The main meal was at noon. The women worked hard in the morning to get the meal ready; everything was made from scratch. The shops shut down between 12 noon and 3 pm and then reopened until 7 pm. Dad's aunt would cook on a wood stove which also had an open tank at one end to fill with water for heated water. Her son was building a new house next door and had a wood stove also for heating water, but his system had a round tank like our hot water tanks mounted horizontally on the wall. We would build a fire to heat the water and when you loaded the firebox the second time, you had enough hot water for a shower.

Hugo also married and lived in Renton after the army and worked in the milk business and retired from Foremost. He had one son Doug and two daughters Linda and Tonya. My grandfather died at the age of 80 in 1965 and my grandma died at the age of 82 in 1970. They are both buried, along with Iro, at the Black Diamond Cemetery. Steve Toschi





#### <u>Autism:</u>

Autism is a mental condition, present from early childhood, characterized by difficulty in communicating and forming relationships with other people, in using language, and in understanding abstract concepts.

About 1 in 69 children are affected in varying degrees. Children, teens, and adults with autism spectrum (ASD) are often inclined to excel in the arts, and can be highly creative. Others may excel in math and science.

A strength that I have noted in my grandson is the ability to block outside distractions. Remember the definition of autism talks of difficulty communicating and forming relationships. This likely leads to his ability to block distractions. In Byron's case, this translates to the ability to bowl well. Where many people may be distracted by other bowlers, once he is up to bowl those other bowlers are no distraction.

In the coming months, I would like to explore needs that families affected by ASD have that lodges might be able to assist with in their communities. Those needs may vary from community to community depending on what is available. If you have thoughts or experience in this area, or would like to be involved, please contact me.
