



In this Fall issue, we would like to share the following story by Kathy Herrin-DiNicola whose family enriched Renton with their Italian heritage in the 1800s.



I met my husband Fred DiNicola in Alaska. He was working on the pipeline, and I was teaching in Valdez. Fred was raised in Northern Minnesota. Both his Mom and Dad came from Italy; his Dad from the Rome area and his Mom from the Naples area. They were an arranged marriage. Fred's Dad joined the U.S. military to earn his citizenship. The Herrin

Family came to the U.S. from Aosta, Italy, in about 1879. Great Uncle Louis bought 40 acres in Maple Valley in 1893. My Grandfather Joe came to the U.S. sometime after his brother Louis. Our current home rests on part of that property, including a specially built bocce court. The original home where I was raised still sits on the property. Grandpa Joe worked in the Black Diamond coal mine until he was run over by a full coal car, causing him to lose his leg. The brothers had sent back to Italy




