"Benvenuto alla Stagione Autunnale" (Welcome to the Autumn Season) The temperature is cooling, the deciduous leaves are turning vivid fall colors, and our view of Mt. Rainier is spectacular during the fall season. Please do not let your guard down . . . the Corona and multiple other viruses are still on the attack. Your Black Diamond brothers and sisters pray for your patience in maintaining your safety and security. As we cautiously watch the medical guidelines, we eagerly await the opportunity to invite you to a yet-to-be-scheduled in-person Black Diamond meeting or function. We are considering a Black Diamond Holiday Feste Caravan and would be delighted to include you.

Please share your condolences with the Vacca family for the loss of Linda (wife of State Trustee and Black Diamond Lodge Sentinel Darrell).

While you are preparing for Halloween and All Saints Day, we invite you to enjoy our next Vasereno Baxter family story. As the story begins, Marianna Olivelli married Antonio Vaserani in Italy. They left for America from the small town of Reggio Emilia in the province of Reggio Emilia and the region of Emilia-Romagna in 1921. At that time Grandma Mary was 26 years old and Grandpa Tony was 29 years old. Tony was born in Genoa. Marianna was an orphan, so we are unable to trace any of her past. For them to immigrate, Paul Fiorito in America was their sponsor. Mary was pregnant with her firstborn during the voyage to America. Uncle Charlie was born shortly after they arrived at Ellis Island in 1921. During the immigration process, Tony was misunderstood pronouncing his last name. It was permanently



changed from Vaserani to Vasereno.

They settled in a small town in Washington State called Lebam where Emma (Bea) Baxter was born in 1922. Emma had three brothers, all of whom served in the military during World War II. Bea was a proud member of Black Diamond Lodge from 2000 until her passing in 2007.

A favorite Lodge legacy was her participation in the Black Diamond Labor Day Parade. She and her great-grandson Jon represented Lodge 1809 by driving two "Giovanni Caro" (John Deere) lawnmowers regaled with Italian kitchen utensils and pulling wagons of dry ice induced boiling pots of pasta. That was one of Bea's prouder membership moments, along with her studious participation in the Black Diamond Lodge Italian classes, when she told her daughter Jeanne and son Wade to do their homework before each session.

The family moved to Chehalis, Washington, where they acquired a small 30-acre dairy farm. Owning a dairy

farm provided the family with plenty of ingredients for making a variety of cheeses from ricotta to well-aged Parmesan. They also raised a couple of hogs. To a child, the hogs they raised were enormous. The hogs provided delicious salamis and sausages prepared by my grandma and grandpa that would last the entire year.


We also feasted on "fried" cream slathered on homemade bread. I also watched Grandma Mary make ravioli. Her hands were so fast placing the filling on the pasta sheets. My dad, Paul, always said Mary was the best cook ever. I only wish I could have had more time to spend with my grandparents to learn their traditional ways. I am reminded every time I visit an Italian deli of the smells from Grandma's kitchen. In 1980 I opened a deli in Federal Way and named it "Olivelli Deli" using my grandmother's maiden name.



Grandpa Tony was also quite the wine and homebrew maker. He acquired several large wine barrels and annually prepared his famous neighborhood wine. One time during prohibition his neighbor came and told him the inspector was on his way. Tony poured out all his wine and beer. However, the inspector never arrived.

In 1966 I was the first family member to travel back to

Reggio Emilia. I visited my grandfather's brother, my great uncle, and other family members. We were treated like royalty and fed a wonderful dinner of homemade spaghetti and meat sauce with homemade Parmesan. The



friend I was traveling with spoke French. The neighbor came over to translate my English to my friend's French to the neighbor's Italian. Who knows what was actually being said?




