The National Women's Action Committee has been focusing on sharing information on famous Italian American Women. For November, we would like to spotlight the life of Mother Cabrini in honor of the 75th Anniversary of her Canonization on July 7, 1946, the first American Saint. A special Jubilee Year Celebration began on Saturday, November 13, 2021, and will conclude on November 13, 2022.

Frances Cabrini was born in a small village near Milan on July 15, 1850. As a young child, she was enamored by stories of missionaries and decided she wanted to join a religious order. She obtained a teaching certificate, and in 1880 she, along with seven young women, founded the Institute of the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart of Jesus in Italy. This group was the first Italian female congregation to bear the formal title (Missionary). Shortly thereafter as a servant of the Catholic Church, Frances Cabrini followed the direction of Pope Leo XIII to aid Italian

immigrants' transition to American life Catholicism.

Nine years after she founded the Mis-Jesus, she set off to America arriving in much poverty before the 20th Century, catechism and education classes for the the needs of many orphans.

In conclusion, Frances Cabrini was an Italian immigrant who became a citizen of the United States of America and the first American to be declared a saint by the Catholic Church.

With dignity and grace, she endured adversity as an Italian American female, overcoming obstacles and committing herself to immigrants and the less fortunate. She died on December 22, 1917, in Chicago.

More than a century later, on Monday, October 12, 2020, Governor Cuomo unveiled a monument to Francesca Xavier Cabrini in Battery Park City during the state's Columbus Day celebrations. The monument stands against a backdrop of Ellis Island and the Statue of Liberty, depicting Mother Cabrini on a paper boat. The artists (Sculptors Giancarlo and Jill Biagi) said the two children aboard are sailing the New World from Europe. The girl holds onto the boat, symbolizing her steadfastness while the boy grips his luggage, ready to face the future. A mosaic beneath the sculpture was created, with help from the Cabrini Museum in Italy, with riverbed stones from Mother Cabrini's birthplace. Jill Biagi, one of the sculptures, said of the statue, "By putting her in the boat, it symbolizes her ability to withstand all the adversities of life in search of realizing her dream," Her dream was to help the needy. The Romans celebrated a harvest festival called Cerelia, which honored Ceres, the goddess of agriculture, grain, and fertility (and from which the word cereal comes). The festival was held each year on October 4 and the first fruits of the harvest were offered to Ceres. Their celebration included music, parades, games, sports, and a feast.

Thanksgiving in Italy? The transliteral phrase in Italian for Thanksgiving, La Festa del Ringraziamento, refers to a variety of religious holidays held throughout the year for patron saints. What matters most during La Festa del Ringraziamento is not what ingredients are used for the meal, or who won the football game, but the opportunity for families and communities to come together and celebrate the season in a tradition that is timeless. Our October meeting was highlight-



ed with costumes, camaraderie, and Halloween hilarity complemented by a baked potato dinner and a beautiful cake decorated by our baking artist Barb Cloud to carry our 85th-anniversary

The October meeting was well attended. As with Lodges across Washington, and the Nation, we have members we want to keep in our thoughts and prayers. We sadly share the news of the passing of our long-time member Caroline Putnam in early October. Her son Rick attended our meeting and shared with us what the Lodge meant to Caroline. She found great joy in the meetings; the organization was particularly important to her. She often mentioned to her children how much she enjoyed attending the Lodge meetings and visiting with the other members. His family is grateful for the part OSDIA played in her life. His sharing reminded me that you never know what benefit Lodge membership is to someone. This a good reminder to reach out to all members at the meetings, especially those who miss a meeting or two. Connection is a valuable and often overlooked element of Lodge membership.

Our story time this month was provided by Armando Muggia. The story begins at the end with a quote from his father. "We know what freedom means because we lost everything." Armando's family story reminds us of the turmoil the citizens of Italy suffered during the communist occupation. His father came from Istria (now part of Croatia) and was part of the resistance during WWII. Fearing for his life, he made his way to Trieste, Italy, where he met and married Armando's mother. Armando was born in Trieste. Working with the United States consulate, the Muggias came to America; his father was considered a "displaced person" (a part of President Truman's Displaced Persons Act of 1948). They originally settled in Buffalo, NY and his father was employed by the GM Chevrolet.

There was a very tight, close-knit Italian community at the



Chevy plant at that time; they looked after his father and helped him acclimate to his new life. Buffalo weather was much more extreme than Trieste, and after some time, Armando and his mother moved to California, which is where Armando started school.

He spoke no English when he entered kindergarten. Armando became a U.S. citizen in an anecdotal way. During the citizenship process, the judge turned his attention from the

adults to Armando, who was just a child. The judge pointed to him and said, "you are now a United States citizen." No program to go through, no test to take - the judge spoke, and it was done. Once his father joined the family in California, he opened a restaurant. From a young age, Armando started working in that restaurant; he held every position in the business. Starting as a busboy and working on up. Although both his grandfather and father were restaurant owners, Armando did not want to follow in their footsteps. Armando, his wife Paula and their children share a love for America.

They have respect and gratitude for the opportunities given, and the importance a new life had to his parents, grandparents, and ultimately Armando. He is a United States Navy veteran, their son, Matthew is a proud Marine, and their daughter, Claire, currently supports our veterans by working for the Veterans Administration. Armando played a 20-yearold recording of an interview with his father. The sincere statements of his father, still with the melodic Italian accent, will never get outdated. He believed the United States was paradise – in his words: "There is no other country in the world so beautiful, so free...Sometimes people don't know what the word freedom means...We know what means freedom, because we lost everything."

Thank you to Armando for sharing not just his story but for reminding us of a part of Italian history that sometimes slips away in today's fast-changing world. Armando and his wife Paula are a welcome and wonderful addition to our Lodge, as well as Claire who always supports and attends our events. (She also makes delicious focaccia bread). Although Armando did not get into the restaurant business, he sure learned a thing or two working with his father. At each meeting, we are treated to a delicious Muggia dish. He mentioned a popular family traditional Thanksgiving dish involving sauerkraut... now doesn't that raise a lot of questions. Maybe some folks are familiar with it, but I am looking forward to sampling the sauerkraut Italian (Trieste) style.
