The American Italian Club of Spokane lodge #2172 cohosted with the Sister City Association of Spokane Board and the Cagli-Spokane Sister City Board the official celebration and dedication of the "Teatro and Torrone" monument in the Sister City Connection Gardens on Saturday, September 18th, 2021. Although raindrops fell, they did not dampen the spirits of those in attendance. There was a "Plan B", and 50+people were moved inside to the U.S. Pavilion in Riverfront Park.

Dr. John Caputo, President of the Sister City Association of Spokane, and our "own" club Orator of Lodge #2172 welcomed Elisabetta Valentini, Honorary Consul of Italy, Seattle, Washington, who read aloud a message from the artist of the sculpture Ettore Gambioli, who was not present: "The message of this sculpture is to represent the city of Cagli with two of the most important symbols", Gambioli wrote. "Making this sculpture gave me the opportunity to pay homage to the city of Cagli and Spokane".

Ettore Gambioli has worked on many historical buildings throughout central Italy. Gambioli depicted the ceiling of a "Teatro communale" (1878), or community theatre, and "Torrione Martiniano" (1481) a tower that is now a museum. All his pieces are handcrafted in his workshop in Cagli. continued next page...

Columbus: Fact vs. Fiction Introduction

This study on Christopher Columbus was undertaken by the Commission for Social Justice, the anti-defamation arm of the Order Sons of Italy in America (OSIA) in response to growing concerns about the celebration of Columbus Day in America. For much of its history, the United States considered Columbus a man worthy of admiration. Columbus Day is one of America's oldest patriotic holidays, first celebrated in the 18th century. America has more monuments to Columbus than any other nation in the world. Generations of American school children studied his life and accomplishments. Teachers held him up as an example of a person of character, who overcame strong opposition and great disappointment but never gave up trying to prove what he believed to be true.

Since 1992, however, the reputation of Columbus has suffered at the hands of special interest groups who have used this 15th century Renaissance navigator to further their 21st century political and social agendas.

As a result, today Columbus is often depicted as a slave trader, racist, and even "the Hitler of the 15th century." A small but vocal number of historians, journalists, text-book writers, and teachers have helped spread these charges despite their questionable foundation in historical fact.

They have done so principally by judging a quintessentially Renaissance man and his actions by contemporary values. It bears noting that England did not outlaw slavery in its colonies until 1833; the United States until 1865 and Brazil in 1888. Some nations in the Mid-East, Asia and Africa continue the practice today.

Despite this controversy, Italian Americans continue to hold Columbus in high regard both for his historic achievements and because Columbus Day is the only day our nation recognizes the heritage of an estimated 16 to 26 million Americans of Italian descent, who are relentlessly stereotyped by the entertainment, news, and advertising industries the other 364 days of the year. Increasingly, however, Italian American communities are finding their Columbus Day celebrations marred by demonstrations and their First Amendment rights denied by special interest groups who sometimes turn violent as has been happening in Denver since 2000.

We therefore offer this study on Columbus as an attempt to bring more balance to the examination of this first important Renaissance navigator, his life, character and explorations.

We thank Columbus scholars Robert Royal, Ph.D., president of the Faith and Reason Institute; Joseph Scafetta, Jr. and David Curfman, M.D., president of the National Columbus Celebration Association in Washington, D.C., for sharing their impressive knowledge of Columbus with us.

This study was prepared by Dona De Sanctis, Ph.D., OSIA Deputy Executive Director. First released in 2002, the present report updates and expands the previous version.

A little bit of gossip, well not actually gossip because Laura told us this herself, while in Florence Laura met an Italian man close to her age (we asked), they spent some time together and he's asked her to come back to Italy for Christmas, so Laura said she's mulling that over. I'll let you know how it turns out.

If it turns out well, it could end up being made into a Hall-mark movie.

miners in town to help support the growing family. By 1912 Maria and Venerio had three sons: Riziero (born in 1903), Leonoro (1905), and Emilio (1912). Riziero and Leonoro had their names changed to Richard and Leonard, respectively. Emilio (my father) was born in America and his name remained. However, back then almost everyone in Black Diamond had a nickname, and our family was no exception. Richard became "Boots," Emilio became "Meg," and Maria became "Maria Longa" (Italian for long, tall Mary). When Maria sent Emilio to first grade in Black Diamond, she spoke little to no English and misspelled Emilio as "Meglio." Consequently, the other classmates shortened the misspelling to "Meg." For the rest of his life, my father was called Meg by everyone he knew.

In 1918-1919 the worldwide Spanish Flu pandemic hit Black Diamond. Maria Longa didn't come down with the flu. She was able to care for as many sick townspeople as possible. Emilio's classmate Bruno Betti told me Maria was an angel of mercy during the pandemic. The three Pierotti sons were athletes. Richard "Boots" played soccer, and his nickname came about that time. Leonard played professional baseball in the AAA Pacific Coast League. Meg received a football scholarship to the University of Washington (UW) in 1931. Boots and Meg were charter members of the Black Diamond Sons of Italy Lodge. Our cousin Evo Toschi was president of the Black Diamond Sons of Italy Lodge for two years in the 1980s.

Bonnie Birch, a current member of Sons of Italy (and talented musician), is a cousin of mine by marriage. Her grandfather,



Abramo Pennacchi (a great craftsman and winemaker), and my grandmother, Maria Pierotti (both widowed at the time) were married in the 1930s. Maria passed in 1938. Black Diamond Sons of Italy has a special place in the Pierotti family history. Tragedy struck the Pierotti's in 1927 when Uncle Leonard died and, again, in 1931 when Uncle Boots' leg was crushed between two

coal cars. After his brother Boots' mining accident, Meg quit college and ended his football career at the UW. Meg immediately went to work in the timber industry to pay Uncle Boots' doctor and hospital bills. It was what families did for each other in those days! No questions or complaints from

Meg; he knew exactly what to do for his brother.



Later Boots and Meg built a commercial building together on Hwy 169. Boots borrowed \$2,000 from Abramo Pennacchi. This financed the business and building called Boots Tavern. Boots Tavern was a successful business serving Black Diamond and surrounding areas until Boots' retirement in 1965. Behind the tavern were two small trailer homes where Boots would offer shelter to anyone in need of a place to stay. Boots was serving the homeless long before they

were called "homeless." Boots Tavern has had the same name since 1937 but many different owners since Boots' retirement. Boots passed away in 1989, after a life well-lived, spending almost his entire life in Black Diamond. My father Meg moved from Black Diamond to Renton in 1944 to be closer to

may be too late to purchase a calendar for the annual Grand Lodge Fundraiser, however on the chance they are not all sold, if you would like one check with Robin Miller or




