Tony Anderson is the type of guy who everyone seems to know. Ask just about any local leader whether they know him, and you're likely to get an enthusiastic yes. The same holds true among everyday citizens as well, friends and acquaintances he's met along the way who know him as the big, friendly Italian who always has time to stop and talk, share a smile and call you "pal."

"He's a very proud Italian and a first-class guy. That's Tony Anderson," said Franco Marchio, known better around town as Franco the Tailor. When Marchio was 19 years old, he came to the U.S. from Italy and opened a tailoring shop in downtown Tacoma, now located in the Stadium District. The year was 1964 and Franco remembers 7-year-old Tony coming into the shop holding his mother's hand.

"Here we are 55 years later and we're still very good friends," Franco said. "He's got a big heart and he would do anything for anybody, and especially his family and his friends. He's one of the nicest guys I've ever met."

Franco loves teasing his friend any chance he gets. "I tease him all the time. When a new customer comes in and they know Tony, I say, 'If I'm able to take care of Tony with the extra-large size, I will be able to do magic for you," Franco said through good-natured laughter.

Anderson was born in Tacoma on July 10, 1957, and just celebrated his 65th birthday. "I didn't think I'd get to 65 this quick," he says. "I can see my 10th birthday party at our house in the south end of Tacoma like it was yesterday then boom – I'm 65."

As a boy, Anderson started his schooling in 1st grade at Our Lady of the Holy Rosary in Ta-coma. In the 5th grade, he transferred to All Saints parish in Puyallup then to White River High School when he and his family moved to Buckley before returning to Tacoma after he graduated. Talented in sports, Anderson lettered in football, wrestling, and baseball. Out of high school, Anderson enlisted in the Ma-rines but an illness that nearly took his life prevented him from staying long. From there, he worked for the Department of Agriculture on the Tacoma waterfront as a railroad car and ship inspector then got his license to be a wheat inspector. However,

a tumble off a railcar left Anderson with injuries that required many surgeries and still afflict him to this day.

Despite medical setbacks that would be with him for the rest of his life, Anderson didn't let anything stop him from being active in his community. In 1987, he joined the Order of the Sons & Daughters of Italy in America.

For nearly 35 years, Anderson has been involved with the Order's Grand Lodge of the Northwest and at the national level. He has served in numerous offices and committees for nearly 20 years locally and nationally including three terms as president of the Grand Lodge Northwest and two terms as national secretary. He is now in his first term as the Order's national fifth vice president, the first person from the Pacific Northwest to get elected to a national office ever since the Grand Lodge Northwest was established 100 years ago. Every two years he will move up until, if all goes well, he becomes national president in nine more years, which will be another first for the Northwest region.

When asked if Anderson has a good chance at the national presidency, current president Bob Bianchi said, "I would be shocked, based on everything he has done and the respect he has from the organization, if he didn't. He is one of my major go-to's as national president."

Bianchi said his first impression of Anderson was that he is a man who speaks his mind and Bianchi found that refreshing. "He doesn't care if his rightful opinions offend those that are in power and potentially jeopardize his advancement in the organization. He's bold, courageous, smart and a people person, but he will not suffer fools lightly. He's got all the skills of a leader that I like. He'll listen, he'll try to strike compromise, and he deals well with people who have a differing opinion." Rosetta Stella Beyersdorf is a past Grand Lodge Northwest president and a national trustee. "He never refuses to do anything," she said of her friend Tony. "If he can't do it in person, he will either donate something or find somebody else to step in. Even if his back or knees are hurting, he always does what he can. He's such a great leader."

In 1991, Anderson joined Tacoma Sister Cities, serving on its board of directors since 1993 and as chair from 2003-2008. He served on the Sister Cities International board from 2001-2004 and then was immediately named an honorary board member. In 2015, the honorary board honored him with the Ruth Hashimoto Award, the highest award presented to an honorary board member for exemplifying Sister Cities' mission to "promote peace through mutual respect, understanding, and cooperation – one individual, one community at a time."

One of Anderson's proudest achievements with Tacoma Sister Cities is his work as chair of the U.S. – Japan Cultural Baseball Exchange Program.

"I had the great honor and opportunity to go to Japan seven times and host them here that many times as well," Anderson said. "From 1987 to the end of 2009, we had more than 1,000 kids take part in that program from both sides so there's generations of understanding there. They would stay with host families, so they were directly immersed in the culture. They found out the most important thing – that no matter where we live, people are more alike than we are different." In recognition of his efforts, Tony received the 50th Anniversary Award from the City of Kitakyushu and Mayor Kenji Kitahashi.

Because of his involvement with the baseball exchange program, in 2009 Anderson was inducted into the Tacoma-Pierce County Sports Hall of Fame and received its Dill Howell Award for his passion, commitment, and continued support for baseball in the Tacoma-Pierce County community.

Since 1992, he has been a life member of the Tacoma Athletic Commission (TAC) where he served three terms as vice president and three terms as president. He has served on the Golden Gloves Committee since 1994.

TAC past president Doug McArthur, 93, watched Anderson grow going back to when Tony was in high school. "When I first renewed membership in the TAC, I was sports director for KTAC radio," McArthur said. "Much of what we broadcast was TAC inventory. Tony joined right in at our broadcast sites and you'd never guess that he wasn't a 'pro' in the announcing field. He was a superb partner on those sports broadcasts. "I always try to give people like Tony this acknowledgment: ATTAWAY, Tony, ATTAWAY!"

Anderson's sports-related achievements and awards are too lengthy to fully list here. He is in the Tacoma-Pierce County Old Timers Baseball-Soft-ball Association Hall of Fame and is a recipient of its Marc H. Blau Meritorious Service Award. In 2008, he received the Kurt Gegner Award from the National Football Foundation for community service.

Anderson's activities have been noticed throughout the city with a 2005 City of Destiny Award for Adult Leadership-Cultural Ambassador, and a 2019 Service Award from Bates Technical College. He was asked

to serve on the City of Tacoma's Citizens Recognition Committee (2005-2014), and at the Boys & Girls Clubs of South Puget Sound, Anderson was a corporate board member in 2007 and served on its executive board from 2008-2010. For Anderson, he said he wouldn't be where he is today without all those in his life who have worked beside him for common goals.

"When I was young and going to Catholic school, the nuns had us out doing community service work and I quickly figured out, because of sports and so forth, that anything we accomplish in life is never accomplished alone, but together. That's my motto. If we work as a team, we'll be successful and, God forbid, if we're not, at least we did it together as a team."







# Do You Really Want Members?


