Harvey and Joan Woodruff have been members of Black Diamond Lodge since 1995, and we would like to introduce you to Joan's Italian heritage.

My great, great grandfather Andrew Verzani came from Barga, Italy (in the province of Luca in Tuscany, central Italy) where his family-owned and operated a marble quarry. He was born in 1819, the firstborn of seven children. He and his brother Francesco came to America in 1853 landing in New York. He entered into a marriage agreement with a French family to marry their oldest daughter but before the marriage happened, she eloped with another man. To honor the marriage agreement, my great, great grandfather married the next oldest daughter, Louise Mary. They married in 1857. My grandfather was 38 and Louise Mary was 17.

My great grandfather Andrew II was born in 1858 in New York. He was the oldest of ten children. After he was born, the family journeyed from New York to Nebraska. They later moved to Elk Point, South Dakota where Andrew made an application for homesteading in 1867. In 1872 he received the fourth homestead granted by the Dakota Territory. While living in the Dakota Territory, Andrew II married Julia Post. My grandmother, Norena Verzani Marek was born in



1885 and was the third of ten children. My grandmother, Norena came out west to Lewiston, Idaho when she was 15 to help take care of her sick grandmother. My grandfather James Marek followed my grandmother out to Idaho and they soon married in 1904. My grandmother was 16 and my grandfather

was 19 when they married. After my grandparents got married, my great-grandparents moved from South Dakota to Lewiston, Idaho as well. My great grandfather owned and operated a meat market in Lewiston. He died in 1917 and my grandmother Julia died in 1948. My grandparents James and Norena Verzani Marek bought a farm on the Webb Ridge in Lapwai, Idaho. There they farmed hay, wheat and raised cattle. They also raised a large garden in which to feed their nine children. My mother, Juanita Marek Sanford, was their sixth child.

I loved to help my grandmother make pasta. My twin brothers and I would eat the raw pasta when she put it on the drying rack. In an attempt to deter us from eating all her hard work, she would tell stories of giant balls of dough in our stomachs that would require a


