- OSIA was established in 1905 to support immigrants from Italy
- OSIA membership is currently approximately 34,000 members
- OSIA has nearly 350 lodges with Grand Lodges in 17 states
- OSIA's mission is to encourage the study of Italian language and culture in schools, preserve Italian culture, traditions, heritage and history, and to promote closer relations with Italy
- OSIA's major charities supported locally and nationally include Alzheimer's research, Cooley's Anemia, Cancer, and Autism as well as disaster relief in the U.S., Italy and other countries
- Students are given scholarships at the local, state, and national levels.
- OSIA's organizational structure at the national level includes a **Supreme Council** of elected officers representing all states, a **Commission for Social Justice**, the anti-defamation branch that fights negative advertising and all activities that stereotype Italian Americans, and the **Sons of Italy Foundation**, which is the non-profit charitable branch that filters all charity funds from local and state lodges and national fundraisers to our national charities
